Care Ministry Team

Here is an opportunity to learn how we care for others in our community and congregation. Would you be willing to make a meal, fill the Blessing Box, or organize a charitable event (Advent/Lent dinners, Thanksgiving baskets, Angel Tree - etc.)? This just might be the place for you!

Community Care Day

The purpose of Community Care Day is to demonstrate God's love by providing 'Back to School Needs' to families in Jackson that will help to alleviate some of the financial pressure before school begins in the fall.

Working in partnership with Redeemer Lutheran, there are many ways we need your help and support to serve 400-600 people. From shopping for supplies, being a table host or hostess at the meal, guiding people through the building or leading a team. There is a way for everyone to find a fit during this powerful day within our community.

Harvest Dinner

The Harvest Dinner is a longstanding community event where homemade applesauce, mashed potatoes, sauerkraut, apple and pumpkin pies are served along with roast pork. Many hands and helpers are needed all week long and the day of the dinner.

Funeral Meal Contributions

You can help in the kitchen for funeral dinners or provide contributions of desserts and salads. Sign up to be on the rotation of providers.

Prayer Chain

Our purpose is to give members an opportunity to pray for the needs of those around us. For emergencies that arise, health and other life concerns, for thanksgiving, etc., we offer our prayers to God. For privacy reasons, prayer requests must have the approval of the person or family member before being sent to the prayer chain. Prayer requests are currently sent to the team lead by phone or e-mail. The requests are then forwarded by e-mail. We ask that you pray as soon as you receive the e-mail.

Home-Communion Visitor

This Ministry team provides Holy Communion to members (or other qualified persons) who are confined to their homes or a care facility. In addition to serving Holy Communion, the visitor provides fellowship, prayers and, on occasion, advocacy for special needs. Visits are made monthly and take about an hour. Qualifications include a positive personality, being a patient listener and the ability to pray for and with the member. (In compliance with LCMS recommendations, the serving of Holy Communion is limited to male servers.)

Hospital Visitors/Visitation

When the church office is notified of a member's hospitalization in Jackson, the Hospital Visitation Team visits that member each weekday they are hospitalized. Members of the team are assigned a regular 'visitation day'. The team leader trains and accompanies new team members on their first few visits.

Connections Ministry

Come alongside of newcomers and members alike to help them feel included and welcome here at Trinity Lutheran Ministries.

If you make friends easily, become one of our 'friends-of-newcomers' team who regularly watches for returning newcomers so that these newcomers will come to know and recognize a friendly face and feel comfortable enough to ask questions.

Volunteer to become a **new member mentor** that will intentionally connect with a new member, for a season, by

- sitting with them in church
- introducing them to others with shared interests
- sharing a meal or two together
- inviting them to come along with you when you go to church/school event, perhaps even offering to pick them up to go to the event together.

Ladies Aid

Ladies Aid Membership

Meetings:

Ladies Aid meets at 10am in the Fellowship Hall on the second Thursday of every month. We have a devotion, a business meeting, and refreshments.

- Ladies Aid assists with Trinity's outreaches such as the Harvest Dinner and Community Care Day.
- Ladies Aid raises money to assist with unexpected needs of the church and school.

The Lutheran Women's **LW∕∕∕∖L** Missionary League (LWML), an auxiliary

organization with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS), strives to develop the spiritual gifts of women through fellowship, Christian growth and mission service.

Trinity Lutheran LWML members participate by sending Mite* money to the Michigan District and the National LWML to support all mission grants chosen at the respective conventions.

Pick up your Mite Box at the TRIP counter in the Narthex.

Each member of Trinity is invited to participate in this huge outreach of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Mite collection suggestions from years past:

- Put your pennies in the box at the end of each day
- Say "thank you" with an appropriate amount whenever calamity or misfortune has been averted
- Empty all your loose change from your kitchen coin bowl into the box on meeting day

*What is a Mite?

Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1–4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of "mites" — offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS. Mite Box contributions amount to millions of dollars that fund district and national mission grants and implement the LWML program.

History of the Mites Collection

Perhaps inspired by the various "cent" or "mite" societies of the early 1800s, many Lutheran Ladies Aid societies used a box to gather funds in support of local and synod ministries. Records from 1930 indicate receipts from the 92 Ladies Aid societies totaled \$6651.31!

The LWML was formally recognized by the LCMS in 1942. They continued collecting mites. As of March 31, 2019, contributions for the previous 24 months totaled \$ 2,172,373.76 from LCMS members in 43 countries all to be given as grants to missions. LCMS Districts retain 75% of mite offerings for the work of the LWML at that level. National mites fund over \$1 million in mission.

Book Nook

The Book Nook is a ministry of Cotta Missionary Guild and is recognized by Concordia Publishing House as a CPH resource center. The Book Nook sells Christian reading materials, boxed greeting cards and gifts. Special orders are welcome. You can visit the Book Nook during the week in the church office hallway.

The interesting story behind the name!

- Cotta Missionary Guild was established in 1948. The women who formed the group came up with "Cotta" in recognition of Ursula Cotta, who took Martin Luther into her home for four years while he attended school in Eisenbach, Germany.
- Luther's home was about 100 miles away, and his family was poor, so he initially went door-to-door, singing for tokens and handouts to help support himself. Frau Cotta took notice of him. She had watched as others turned him away. She was intrigued by his demeanor, his resilience and his voice. When he came to her door, she didn't hesitate to take him in.
- The founders of Cotta Guild committed themselves to following Ursula Cotta's example. They didn't intend to change the world, but they were determined to help programs and organizations that didn't have multiple sources of funding, weren't well known, but showed great promise.

Bible Study

Meets at Kathy Frusti's Summit Township home for 9-10 weeks at a time breaking for Advent, Lent and summer. All ladies are invited to join. The group mainly uses LifeLight for their studies. Home study is helpful but not required.

Alternate Thursdays at 1 pm.

Discussion Group meets in the Hans home on the north side of town. Their purpose is to provide an opportunity for open conversation and opinion on the Scriptures and current issues associated with the LCMS. All are welcome!

1st & 3rd Mondays at 2pm.

Meets in the Trellis Gardens section of Vista Grand Villa. This devotion provides a worship opportunity with fellow believers in a structured mini-worship service environment. All are welcome to attend and provide encouragement and fellowship to shut-ins.

New-To-Trinity Class

This is for anyone interested in joining Trinity, transferring to Trinity or simply learning more about our church and growing as a disciple of Jesus. The topics for these weekly Bible studies include Who is Jesus, Baptism, Lord's Supper, Worship, Prayer and others. The 8 weeks of classes are tentatively scheduled to begin mid-September and early January.

TRIP

Tuition Reimbursement Incentive Program

All school families are encouraged to participate in the TRIP program. TRIP is a great way to reduce your tuition cost simply by doing your everyday shopping. Tuition credits earned through the TRIP program can amount to several hundred dollars.

All church members are encouraged to support school students and scholarships by participating in TRIP. All rebates earned can be designated as the contributor chooses.

TRIP Program volunteers conduct transactions at weekend services.

The **TRIP Coordinator** schedules volunteers, places weekly orders, oversees the account and coordinates quarterly rebates.

Athletics

Trinity students are given the opportunity to develop Christian character as well as the mental and physical skills needed for life through the athletic program.

The **Athletic Director** organizes athletic events and groups at Trinity School and identifies coaches.

The **Athletic Event Assistant** is an adult who assists coaches and the athletic director at games and tournaments.

Youth Leader

The Youth Leader oversees the youth program and sets the schedule. Responsibilities include ensuring volunteers are in place for events; that youth events are safe, faith-filled and nurturing; that all chaperones have been background checked, providing a safe environment for all. The Youth Leader sets the budget for the year, with the assistance of the Youth Team.

Youth Team

Works together with the Youth Leader in shaping, planning and helping our youth stay in their faith walk.

Youth - Adult Leaders

Assists youth leader with planning, chaperoning, and other tasks as needed. Must have background check and be approved by Youth Leader.

Youth Groups

Young Girls Group

4th-5th grade girls meet together for a nurturing, fun Jesus filled time.

Girls United

Join other high school girls for fellowship and discussion.

Junior High Youth

6th-8th Grades, meet together for fun, fellowship, nurturing, learning more about God in a FUN way.

Senior High Youth

9th-12th Grades, meet together for deeper Bible Study, fellowship, mission/community service.

College Age Group

College students meet for fellowship and discussion of Christian themes and issues.

Seasonal Worship Preparations

Before Advent season in November volunteers help assemble Christmas trees and decorate the church for Christmas. Afterwards, in January the decorations and trees are taken down and carpeting is vacuumed.

'Tool Time' Team

The Thursday morning 'Tool Time' team meets while the Quilters work from 9:00-11:30 am and then joins the ladies for cookies and coffee afterwards.

Muscle Men Team

Help with moving heavy items as needed.

Litter

Enhance the presence of Trinity in our community by picking up litter when you see it.

Gardening

It's always a joy to walk through a beautiful garden! If you like digging in the dirt and the solace of working in a garden you are invited to help Trinity maintain the beauty of our perennial gardens at the church and school entryway.

Yardwork

Mowing the lawn at Trinity school is a big 4-hour job and volunteers can sign up to mow for 1 week or more throughout the growing season. The school has all the equipment needed.

Kitchen Crew

Enjoy the fellowship and satisfaction of working together in the kitchen and setting the scene for eating together. There is always a Serv Safe certified person on duty.

Throughout the year your help is needed for funeral dinners, soup suppers, family meetings, potlucks and community events like the Harvest Dinner.

Music

Choir

The choir leads the congregation in worship and provides special music during the Traditional services. If you have basic music reading skills, can match pitch, and are looking to connect with a fun group then choir is the place for you! We meet most Thursdays from 6:30-7:30 pm and sing about twice a month, once on Saturday and once on Sunday. Choir also sings during worship on Christmas Eve and Holy Week services.

Instrumentalists

Whatever instrument you play, either solo or with an ensemble, you can provide special music and accompaniment to the worship services. Rehearsals are as needed. Instrumentalists generally play for Christmas, Easter and other special services.

If you are an organist or pianist your talents and skill can be added to the rotation of leading the worship services through music.

Worship Team

The worship team leads the congregation in worship through music at the Modern service.

Vocalists: If you have basic music reading skills, are able to match pitch and perhaps even harmonize join our team as a vocalist, who with their inviting stage presence, leads the congregation in worship.

Instrumentalists should have proficiency in their instrument to successfully play songs after one rehearsal.

The worship team meets most Thursdays from 7:45-8:45 pm serving about two times per month on Sunday.

Additionally, the worship team will provide special music during Christmas and Holy Week services.

Sound Tech

If you have an ear for music you can provide clarity and intelligibility of the music for the congregation during the Modern service. Volunteers must have the willingness to learn how to use the sound equipment to its fullest potential and will serve about two times per month.

Acolytes

For students in grades 5-12. Acolytes assist with candle lighting, offering, communion and during processions they carry the cross and banners. Acolytes are scheduled to serve one-two times per month.

Altar Guild

Trinity's Altar Guild members serve by cleaning the chancel area every week and changing the candles and seasonal hangings as needed. They set up for communion and clean up after each service. Vestments worn by pastor(s), assistants and acolytes, as well as altar cloths, are laundered as needed. They also arrange flowers for Christmas and

Easter services. A schedule is made that includes weekly cleaning, communion care for each service and laundry of vestments.

Members choose the area(s) they want to serve. Learning is by doing and you are always working with a person who has experience with each task.

AV Team

Projection: Leads the congregation with the projected slides at each worship service and ensure the service flows from beginning to end. Volunteers must be able to focus for the entire service and may also run the cameras. They will serve about two times per month and occasionally for funerals as required for video and presentations.

Camera: Present the church to the online community through live-streaming at each service and our homebound DVD ministry. Volunteers serve about two times per month.

Video & Special Presentations

Create video and/or slides for use before, during and after the services in the form of announcements, invitations and sermon illustrations.

Worship Volunteers

Communion Assistants

Volunteers are adult men who help pastor serve communion and are scheduled one to two times per month. Training is provided.

Fellowship

In the Narthex, after summer time Sunday services, volunteers contribute finger foods and serve as hosts and hostesses.

Fellowship 'n Faith

Fellowship 'n Faith takes place downstairs between the Sunday worship services from September to May. Fellowship 'n Faith is a relaxed, informal time of conversation and table talk for all ages. Preschoolers through 4th graders can participate in an object lesson and a craft. Simple breakfast foods and beverages are served. Ways of volunteering include setting up, cleaning up, preparing and leading the object lesson or the craft as well as providing food.

Funeral Assistant

Assists pastor in providing care and support to funeral visitors and assists during the service.

Greeters & Welcome Table

Our friendly Greeters reach out, shake a hand and are that first warm smile that sets the tone for our guests and members. After the service, you will find them at the Welcome Table to help our visitors and guests get the information, support and encouragement they are looking for. Greeters serve once a month.

Nursery & Toddler Care

This ministry allows young parents the opportunity to enjoy the worship service knowing their little ones are well cared for. Volunteers serve once a month.

Readers

During the worship service, readers read the Old Testament and Epistle lessons. Volunteers serve once a month.

Ushers

The Usher teams provide order and assistance before, during and after worship services. Teams consist of one lead Usher and two to three other individuals from the congregation. All Trinity confirmed members are eligible to participate on a team. There is one Usher team assigned to each service. Usher teams serve two times a month.

Governance

Council

The Church Council looks out for the welfare of Trinity and is the governing body of the congregation as a whole. Council is responsible to achieve the congregation-approved goals and to administer the congregation's affairs. Council member candidates must be active in worship and bible study, be active members and at least 18 years old. Council members are elected to two-year terms.

School Board

The School Board encourages and provides for the Christian training, spiritual growth, secular education, and physical wellbeing of students in the Day School (School) and Early Childhood Center (Center). Through the Principal, it is responsible for the administration of the School and Center.

Elders

The Board of Elders maintains discipline within the Congregation according to the Scriptures, **Lutheran Confessions and** Matthew 18:15-20. The Elders are concerned with the spiritual, emotional and physical welfare of the Pastoral staff, and mentors and works with them. They also have responsibility for church membership, youth instruction relating to communion and confirmation, and stewardship. Elders are appointed to their position. Elder candidates must be active in worship and bible study, be active members and at least 18-year-old males.

Gratitude Ministry

The Gratitude Ministry provides ongoing stewardship education and encouragement to Trinity members. The Gratitude Ministry humbly seeks greater sharing of time, talents and treasures to support our heavenly Father's missions.

Volunteers meet as needed to fulfill their function, typically 1-2 meetings annually.

information about the

Council appointed volunteers serve 3-year terms and the committee meets as necessary to fulfill their function.
