

HELP WANTED!

The worship and ministries of TCPC rely most heavily on the people of the church volunteering their time and using their gifts (or in some cases, developing new gifts!) to make things happen. Here are some of the areas where we currently have the greatest need for volunteers:

COMING THIS FALL IN SUNDAY SCHOOL

How do I talk to my neighbor about the gospel when she doesn't even believe God exists?

My friend says he's not interested in a religion that has been disproven by science.

Someone asked me how I can believe the Bible when it's so full of errors and contradictions.

I'm finding it harder and harder to believe in God when the world is full of evil and suffering.

As much as we would like it to be the case, sharing the gospel is seldom as simple as telling about what Jesus has done. For many people there are a deep-rooted assumptions and false beliefs about God and the Bible, and these things form a barrier between the gospel and the unbeliever. When we try to share the message of God's salvation through Jesus Christ, these issues and questions can rise up and consume the conversation.

One great misconception about Christianity is that such questions require us to "turn off" our brains and "just have faith." But that is never the case. Though there are many things that might be beyond our understanding, there are also a great many things we *can* understand. Something many Christians are surprised to learn is that whatever questions they hear have already been asked – and answered! – many times before. In all my years of ministry, I have never heard a "new" question or objection to the Christian faith.

A crucial part of our vision as a church is to be influencing our neighbors – the people in

our lives — with the good news. In order to do that, we need to grow in our ability to answer the questions people are asking. To help us grow in that area, our adult Sunday School classes from August 11-September 8 will be on the topic of *apologetics*. How do we answer some of the most common concerns raised by unbelievers? As Christians, how can *we* gain greater confidence and assurance in the truth of God's Word by understanding these things for ourselves?

So come join us, starting Sunday, August 11th at 11:15am, as we learn what it means to *take* every thought captive to obey Christ (2 Cor 10:5) so that we may always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you (1 Peter 3:15).

MEMORIAL WEEKEND CHURCH PICNIC

Perfect weather, great food, and the fellowship of believers; what a wonderful time we had! With over 100 hamburgers and hot dogs grilled, and the church community bringing plenty of tasty sides, the only item we managed to run out of were forks! We were able to reach others in the Treasure Coast community with all the food the Lord provided.



In Acts 15, we see a gathering of many elders, who arrived to represent many different churches. They gathered to discuss important questions and to make decisions that they would agree to carry out together. They issued a joint statement, affirming their unity of mind on a topic. It is based on that gathering – a time of debate and compromise and Biblical unity (though not *uniformity*) – that our denomination arranges an annual gathering of representative elders. We call that time the General Assembly, and Pastor Rob represented TCPC at our meeting in Dallas, TX during the last week of June, joining more than 1.600 other teaching and ruling elders of the Presbyterian Church in America.

The PCA is growing, having added more than 10,000 members and 4 churches this past year. That brings our total to more than 384,000 members (a number that does not include the many people who regularly attend our churches but have not yet joined as members). And those members are spread throughout 1,572 PCA churches in the USA.

During our time at General Assembly, we heard updates from the various ministries that we support and cooperate on. We rejoiced in the planting of new churches, both in the United States and in many countries around the world, hearing of God's amazing provision for his people as they faithfully carry out his work everywhere from Miami to Mongolia to Mozambique.

Many of the ministries of our denomination exist to support and help local churches. For example, if you ever volunteer in children's ministries, there is a podcast called "Grow" that talks about common issues and questions involved in teaching our children in church. There is even an online training program available for children's ministry leaders!



The PCA also organizes disaster relief efforts in crisis-stricken communities in the US. Though one small church may not have the resources to send a whole team into a grieving community, the denomination coordinated several efforts this past year, enabling members of our churches to join together in helping one another.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY TOPICS

A large part of our time at General Assembly is spent in discussion and debate. This year we focused on some important issues, seeking Biblical wisdom and agreement on topics related to human sexuality, sexual abuse, and how our role as spiritual shepherds must be approached with wisdom and great sensitivity on these issues. We considered these topics to be of such importance that we voted to set up two special study committees to guide us on better understanding and applying God's Word in our ministries. The first committee will give "particular attention to the issues of homosexuality, same-sex attraction, and transgenderism" and will present its report at next year's General Assembly. The second committee will "address matters related to domestic abuse, domestic oppression, and sexual assault."



If you would like to hear more about the details of the discussions and actions of this year's General Assembly, feel free to contact pastor Rob directly. Even if you don't know the details, please be assured that at every level of leadership – from your local church all the way to the national gathering of elders – we are seeking to be faithful in applying God's Word and Gospel, in the power of his Holy Spirit, to minister to the needs of his people and of the world where he has called us to be his ambassadors.



TCPC NOW HIRING
