Seasons of the Cross

Green: The colors of the various seasons of the Christian year express the mood or feeling of that season. Green expresses the ongoing work of God and our participation in him and in his work. Though God's work of creating is finished, his work to sustain and grow his Kingdom is not. Particularly, in this season after Pentecost, we strive to live in and through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit - praying and living so as to display and declare the glory of Jesus in all we do.

Scripture Passage and Sermon Outline

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Acts 19:23-29, 32, 34 (ESV)

Title: Riot in Ephesus

Teacher: Josh Floyd

²³ About that time there arose no little disturbance concerning the Way. ²⁴ For a man named Demetrius, a silversmith, who made silver shrines of Artemis, brought no little business to the craftsmen. ²⁵ These he gathered together, with the workmen in similar trades, and said, "Men, you know that from this business we have our wealth. ²⁶ And you see and hear that not only in Ephesus but in almost all of Asia this Paul has persuaded and turned away a great many people, saying that gods made with hands are not gods. ²⁷ And there is danger not only that this trade of ours may come into disrepute but also that the temple of the great goddess Artemis may be counted as nothing, and that she may even be deposed from her magnificence, she whom all Asia and the world worship." ²⁸ When they heard this they were enraged and were crying out, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" ²⁹ So the city was filled with the confusion, and they rushed together into the theater, dragging with them Gaius and Aristarchus, Macedonians who were Paul's companions in travel.

³² Now some cried out one thing, some another, for the assembly was in confusion, and most of them did not know why they had come together.

³⁴ But when they recognized that he was a Jew, for about two hours they all cried out with one voice, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!"

What are your idols?

How do you respond when your idols are exposed or disrupted?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US...

1. Worship the LORD for his power (displayed in breaking the stronghold of idolatry in our hearts). Praise Him Father, Son and Holy Spirit for his gracious kindness shown to sinners like us!
2. Confess to Jesus the ways in which you have looked to idols to do what only the savior Jesus can do. Confess ways in which we look to “things made with human hands” for significance, status or satisfaction.
3. Give thanks to God for Him rescuing us from the bondage of sin and death through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. And thank Him that he exposes our idols so that we may repent of them.
4. Who in your life does not know Jesus and is seemingly content to go on operating an idol factory? Please pray that the Lord would grab ahold of their hearts and begin disrupting those idols. Pray for God-ordained conversations to take place between the two of you.
5. Pray that the Holy Spirit would help you specifically identify the different idols that have taken root in your heart. As you are convicted of these places of idolatry, may the Spirit lead you to a place of grace and repentance rather than a place of condemnation.
