

Don’t allow the arch-enemy of your soul to use any personal disquiet, dismay, and despair to cultivate the fragmenting of fellowship just at the moment the unity of heart and purpose is needed most. Be more concerned with repentance, revival, and renewal than re-opening, and we’ll all be fine. Despite the massive effort to politicize every blasted detail of life, give that a miss when it comes to your church. Remember to pray for those making such challenging decisions and crafting difficult and demanding plans.” - David Cassidy, pastor of Christ Community in Franklin, TN.

What a good and helpful word we all need to keep in mind during this strange time. More than anything else, more than our personal security, peace, or comfort, we need to be revived and renewed in him, remembering that only in him are we more than conquerors in all things and in every situation. *Fix your eyes on Jesus, the founder and finisher of your faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.* (Heb. 12:2). - Pastor Brandon
