THE SCHOOL OF CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY

Whether we realize it or not, the Christian life is a life of theology. By nature, we are all theologians. Everyone has thoughts and beliefs about God, humanity, sin, and salvation - from the outspoken atheist to the pious churchgoer. The question is not whether we have a theology but if our theology is good or bad. Do our beliefs line up with what God has revealed about himself in his word? In his letters, the Apostle Paul often speaks of “sound doctrine” which could also be translated “healthy doctrine.” This reminds us that our beliefs are simply right or wrong. But they are also healthy or unhealthy, life-giving or life-degrading. This class is intended to grow us up in good and life-giving theology.

Beginning Sunday, September 12 from 4:00-5:00 p.m., we will be exploring the basics of Christian Theology in an 11-week class (see schedule below and topics). The goal of this class is not simply to fill our heads with more knowledge but to equip us for living the Christian life, a life of worship, holy living, and joyful fellowship with God.

Because we believe that everyone is a theologian, this class isn't only for those who are well-versed in theology. It's for all those who want to grow in their knowledge of and love for God and his word.
