ORDER OF THE WORSHIP OF GOD

April 6, 2023 Maundy Thursday

Reflection & Preparation

Maundy Thursday is the Thursday of Holy Week, the night Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper and on which he was betrayed. The name derives from the Latin *mandatum novum*, the "new commandment" that Jesus taught his disciples on the night in which he washed their feet: "Love one another, even as I have loved you." Christians have observed Maundy Thursday for centuries as a vivid reminder of Christ's self-giving love and his call to us to share in that love and to make it known in our lives.

⁵ Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷ but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸ And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Leader: For our false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward neighbors, and for

our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us.

Leader: For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those

who come after us,

People: Accept our repentance, O God.

Leader: Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.








Behold the Lamb (The Communion Hymn)






Behold the Lamb (The Communion Hymn) (Simple Piano)




