MONDAY: Pray for Non-Christians / evangelism on our campus – that unbelieving students would engage our ministry and staff – that they would be won to Christ. Pray for a burden for the lost among believing students, and an effective witness on campus.

Luke 19:10 For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost.

TUESDAY: Pray for ministry ownership – that every believing student would be gripped by the gospel and compelled to share their faith – that every believer will take seriously the call to be involved in ministry and making disciples.

Eph 4:11-15 And He gave some *as* apostles, and some *as* prophets, and some *as* evangelists, and some *as* pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ; until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ.

WEDNESDAY: Pray for resilience and endurance during this semester with many added rules, uncertainties, and stresses – that God would use this unique time to develop and refine spiritual character and spiritual maturity in their lives.

Ja 1:2-4 Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have *its* perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing.

THURSDAY: Pray for support and care from the local church, and peer relationships within the crossroads community.

- Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor (**Rom 12:10**)
- Build up one another (**1 Thes 5:11**)
- Care for one another (**1 Cor 12:25**)
- Serve one another (**Gal 5:13**)
- Bear one another's burdens (**Gal 6:2**)

FRIDAY: Pray for biblical thinking on worldview issues – that students would engage social, political, and moral issues through the grid of Scripture as opposed to popular opinion, personal preference, etc. Pray that our Sunday morning equipping time “*Critical Thinking on Critical Issues*” would be helpful in continuing to build and fortify thinking with the mind of Christ.

Rom 12:1 Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, *which is* your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

SATURDAY: Pray for students' priorities and use of time – the college years are a key time to seize and invest for Christ!

Eph 5:15-16 Therefore be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise making the most of your time because the days are evil.

SUNDAY: Pray that students would represent the Lord in the classroom / dorms / workplace

Matt 5:13-15 You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt has become tasteless, how can it be made salty *again*? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled under foot by men. You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden; nor does *anyone* light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven.
