I. God’s Declaration against False Teachers (4)

A. They are *subtle* in their deception and *ungodly* in their character.

- Matt 7:15

B. They face *certain condemnation*.

- James 3:1; Heb 12:29

II. Three Graphic Examples of God’s Judgment (5-7)

A. God Judged the *rebellion* of unbelieving *Israel*. Vs 5

- Numbers 13-14

B. God both *has* chained and *will* judge the rebellious **angels** who rejected his design by **cohabiting** with **women**. Vs 6

i. These demons are chained

- 1 Pet 5:8; Job 1; Eph 6:12

ii. The comparative connection between vs 6-7

iii. The rejection of God’s design

iv. 2 Peter 2:4

v. Gen 6:1-7

1. The “*Bene elohim*” Job 1:6; 2:1

2. They appeared in human form Gen 18:1-8

C. God judged the *immoral rebellion* of Sodom and Gomorrah. Vs 7

- Gen 19:24-25

Conclusion – The supreme place of judgment was at the cross 2 Cor 5:21
