Intro Jude's practical instructions for spiritual stability in times of chaos

- Remember the warnings about false teachers (17-19)
 Remain in the sphere where we experience God's love (20-21)
- **Reach out** to those ensnared in false teaching (22-23)
- Trust the power of the sovereign God (24-25)

I. God is *able* to *preserve* his people 24a

- Eph 3:20; Ps 115:3
- A. He guards us from *final* spiritual *ruin*.
 - i. 1 Pet 2:8 Rom 8:38-39
 - ii. Human perseverance undergirded by divine preservation Phil 2:12-13
- B. No believers are *lost* all are *raised* up (John 6:37-39).
- C. Believers are *secure* (John 10:27-29).

II. God is <u>able</u> to <u>perfect</u> his people

A. We will stand in his glorious *presence*.

- i. Man cannot behold divine glory and live (Exod 33:20; Isa 6; Lk 5:8; Rev 1:17)
- ii. Yet glorified believers will be God's presence one day (1 Cor 13:12; John 17:22-24)

B. We will stand *blameless*.

- Heb 9:14; Eph 5:27
- C. We will stand with great *joy*.

III. God is Himself the <u>exclusive Savior</u>25a

IV. God is *worthy* of our *highest praises* 25b

- A. "Glory..." Radiating brightness and beauty of God.
- B. "Majesty..." Royal Enthronement Prov 21:1; Dan 2:21
- C. "Dominion..." Power or strength Ps 66:7
- D. "Power..." Right to rule
- E. "Before all time, now and forever, Amen"
