In what way is Romans 8:1 a conclusion to the near verses of 7:14-25 and of the larger context in ch 3-7? What are some of the key ideas of Paul's argument in the book leading up to this conclusion? (Consider Rom 1:18-20; 3:19-23; 4:1-5; 5:1-2, 8-10; 6:1, 23 or other key verses you have underlined in your Bible)

How should a Christian's legal status of "no condemnation" impact the following areas of life:

- Daily living (home life, time on the job, etc.)
- Our posture towards spiritual disciplines and sanctification?
- Our view of failure and / or victory in spiritual growth
- God's "smile" or pleasure regarding our life
- Personal hope and identity
