- God has also given Rick the heart of a counselor. Through our various interactions with Rick, many of us have already felt pastored by him. We hope that over time you also will get to know and appreciate his empathetic and compassionate heart.

Rick is authentic about his need for Jesus both in the pulpit and in relationship. BIOGRAPHY

RICK'S BACKGROUND

Rick grew up in the DC area of Virginia in a non-Christian home. He came to know the love of Christ through the ministry of Cru at James Madison University (JMU) where he earned a BA in Religion and a minor in Music in 2000. He also met his wife, Jessie, at JMU, and they got married after graduating in May of 2000. They came to Orlando in 2002 where Rick earned a Masters of Divinity from Reformed Theological Seminary in 2004.



THE GILMARTIN FAMILY

In addition to Rick's passion and skills for preaching and leadership, he is a skilled vocalist and pianist and plays a variety of other instruments (guitar, drums, trombone, trumpet). He also has a love for hospitality, cooking, and a beautiful lawn.

Jessie loves her role as a pastor's wife and mom of four wonderful children. She graduated from James Madison University in 2000 with a major in Psychology and a minor in Early Childhood Education. She stayed home with her children for 14 years and has recently returned to teaching second grade. Jessie enjoys having coffee with friends, walking/running, scrapbooking, reading, and going to amusement parks!

The Gilmartins have four teenage children: Madison (age 17), Becca (age 16), Andrew (age 15), and Luke (age 13).

MINISTRY EXPERIENCE

MINISTRY ROLES

After finishing seminary, Rick and Jessie felt called back to the Shenandoah Valley region of Virginia where he served in the following ministry roles:

- **Director of Worship and Discipleship** at Tabernacle Presbyterian Church in Waynesboro, VA from 2005-2007
- Associate Pastor at Tabernacle Presbyterian Church in Waynesboro, VA from 2007-2009
- Church Planter and Senior Pastor of Holy Cross Presbyterian Church in Staunton, VA from 2009-present

Rick worked with a core group of 35 adults to plant Holy Cross Presbyterian Church, which is now home to 250 men, women, and children. Rick and his team have labored to form a thriving, gospel-centered community through the development of a strong small group ministry, which has seen regular involvement climb as high as 93% of adult members and regular attenders. He has also developed and trained elders, ministry leaders, and staff to direct their worship and church ministries.

MINISTRY PHILOSOPHY

Rick's philosophy of ministry is that, by God's grace, he will give his life to help people...

- Encounter Jesus: to help both believers and non-believers see Jesus through the ministry of reconciliation (2 Cor 5:18-19). This is worked out through prayerful exegesis of the surrounding culture, finding those particular emphases of the Gospel that will be most radioactive (1 Cor 9:19-22).
- **Know Jesus:** to help others know Christ in both the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings (Phil 3:8-11).
- Show Jesus: to help others live out their Christian faith in the world and bring the Kingdom of God to bear on every aspect of their lives. This is true both individually and corporately.

Reference excerpts from Jason McCall, who serves as an elder at Holy Cross and is a close friend:

"Rick is a gifted expository preacher and deeply cares for the preaching and teaching of the word of God. He connects with not only the "churched" but the "unchurched." THE PROCESS - THE SEARCH

In January of this year, your Pastor Search Committee began the task of seeking and finding our next Senior Pastor. Since then, we have met at least once a week, strived to collaborate well together, and developed and executed a 5-phase process. We spent the first few weeks praying, getting to know each other, and discussing where we have been as a church and what characteristics would be most desirable in our next Senior Pastor. We sought and received additional input from a Congregational Survey as well as meetings with the church leadership and staff to develop a UPC Church Profile and a Pastor Profile.

In April, we completed and published these profiles and officially began receiving applications. We then established "deep dive teams" to review materials provided by the 25+ candidates who applied. Those materials included resumes, ministerial data forms, sermons, and written works. We also conducted and evaluated several candidate interviews, asked candidates to complete a written Questionnaire, and collected written and spoken Reference Reports.

We conducted three interviews with Rick by video conference between May 17th and July 19th. On August 13th, we also had an extended conversation with Rick and his wife, Jessie. These interviews were very profitable; the PSC was able to explore Rick's strengths as well as areas where God is still building him up. We continued to move forward with Rick as a top candidate and sent a subcommittee of four to conduct an "Incognito Visit" to Virginia from August 27-28. That subcommittee spent a significant amount of time with Rick and Jessie, visited his church, and heard him preach in-person. The PSC then invited Rick and Jessie to visit Orlando September 15-17 so that they could meet with the entire committee, the Staff, and the Session, as well as tour the UPC campus and surrounding area.

After this visit, the PSC was blessed by a special time of prayer with the congregation on Sunday, September 18th. The next day, the PSC fasted and met together to read aloud the many special prayers that were shared with us by the congregation. After breaking our fast together and conducting a final dialectic discussion, the Pastor Search Committee officially voted to nominate Rick Gilmartin to be our next Senior Pastor.

THE PROCESS - NEXT STEPS

We now look forward to introducing Rick to you! You will have opportunities to see and hear from Rick in-person during his **Candidate Visit Weekend**, **which will take place from Wednesday**, **October 12th through Sunday**, **October 16th**. There are topical conversations planned with Rick earlier in the weekend, as well as a main event planned for Saturday evening. Our hope is that you are able to attend one or more of the events, including Saturday evening, to get more acquainted with and informed about Rick before the Congregational Meeting and vote on Sunday, October 16th.

• Rick will preach a sermon at UPC - 10am in the Worship Center

The Session has called for a Congregational Meeting immediately following the worship service on Sunday, October 16th. The purpose of this meeting will be to vote on calling Reverend Rick Gilmartin as the next Senior Pastor of University Presbyterian Church. All communing members in good standing present at this meeting may vote by printed ballot. We encourage full participation. Childcare will be provided, and parents are encouraged to pack a lunch for their children.

If the congregation votes to extend a call to Rick, the next step will be to seek Presbytery approval, which could occur as early as their next standing meeting on Tuesday, November 15th. We hope that Rick will be able to start his new position before Christmas.

LETTER FROM RICK
