

Session 13-Great Purpose/Great Power
Luke 10: 1-42

1. Jesus appointed 70 disciples to prepare the way for Him. The number is said to be symbolic just as the appointment of the 12 Apostles is said to be symbolic.
 - a. What does the number 12 for the Apostles symbolize?
 - b. What does the number 70 symbolize? See Exodus 24:1,9; Numbers 11:16; and Exodus 15:27.
2. What reasons does Jesus give as to why we must always pray diligently for laborers?
3. Why did Jesus tell the 70, “Carry neither money bag, knapsack, nor sandals; and greet no one along the road.” Luke 10:4.
4. Why did Jesus tell the 70, “And remain in the same house, eating and drinking such things as they give, for the laborer is worth his wage. Luke 10:7.
5. What are at least 3 charges that Jesus gave that would help His messenger reach those to whom he goes?
6. Identify the literal meaning and spiritual meaning found in verse 10:19.
7. As a Christian Laborer, what should we rejoice in?
8. Read verses 10: 21-24. What are the great privileges we have as Christian Laborers?
9. There are two supreme questions of life, questions that could revolutionize the world if we would ask them and then pay attention to their answers. What are they?
10. What does the experience of Martha and Mary teach us?
