### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The last four chapters of Luke will address Jesus' ministry in Jerusalem, His predictions about the future, Peter's denial, Jesus' trial, His resurrection, and ascension. The Book of Luke provides us a careful, historical account and factual account about Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world. After a break the Fall Bible Study will be used to study the Apostle Paul's letters to the church of the Thessalonians. These letters address encouraging the church and understanding persecution.
