# 12. Lead Pastor's Report - John Mahaffey

The year started with 21 Days of Prayer. The church was to focus on Regathering of the people, rebuilding of staff, refocusing vision.

Regathering / Rebuilding

In Jan/Feb 2020 which is normally slower months in the church, and right before Covid took over we were seeing a record of 840-850 people each Sunday. We thought we had a real growth coming. Jan 2022 attendance had an all-time low of 282. November 2022 attendance was 795. We are at 88% of where we were before Covid.

# Rebuilding in-person ministry.

Car show had 1000 people in attendance.

Summer camps had 400 children attend; 38 children received Christ.

By doing smaller camps and more of them we can see more children. This allows us to preach the gospel to more and to train young people in ministry.

Alpha is running, so far, one person has received Christ.

JOY, Builders, Oasis, Youth, Young Adults, Choir, Orchestra, Freedom Session, Steven Ministries- all have started and are doing well. ESL will start soon. Small groups / Community Groups have grown from 22 to 35 at the present.

Pastor Lee is leaving soon. The worship arts division is run very well because of Lee's leadership. We are encouraged that people will step in and help while we seek to find a new worship arts director.

# Refocusing Vision

Pastor John wrote a 60 page paper this past summer called the Great Commission 2030. It is very different from Vision 2020. The Ministry team and Elders read it and discussion took place at the Ministry Team Meeting on October 11 and at the Elder Retreat on November 11.

The following statement has an overarching vision of what we would like West Highland to be by the year 2030. "West Highland will be an international, multi-generational, Gospel-centered church, led by Spirit-gifted, Biblically qualified leaders, characterized by a flourishing disciple-making culture, focused on weekly congregational celebration and small group community, supported by evangelistic and equipping expansion within our parish, throughout our region and into the surrounding communities.

There are two wings of the church, the celebration wing - large group gatherings on Sunday morning and the community wing - small group settings devoted to disciple-making. We need to get everyone in the celebration wing involved in the community wing. This will require an adjustment and change to our focus.

We are committed to increasing expansion within our parish, throughout the region and surrounding communities. It's too early to say what that looks like, but with much pray and seeking, we will tackle the challenges that lie ahead.

At the leader's retreat, the elders and the ministry team spent much time praying and discussing what the GC2030 vision would look like. Several resolutions were made to implement GC2030. More details of this will be shared at a later date.

Dorrett James gave a report on the Christmas Gifts for Christ. Refugee Family from Iran. The family is a man, a son, and a daughter who have fled to Turkey because of their faith in Christ. The man is trying to obtain permission from his ex-wife to have the son come with him to Canada, however, she will turn him

into the police so communication is being done by a third party. We need to raise \$30,000.00 (as per government guidelines to bring this family to Canada.
