My Soul Longs for the Courts of the LORD

To the choirmaster: according to The Gittith. A Psalm of the Sons of Korah.

[1] How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts!

[2] My soul longs, yes, faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and flesh sing for joy to the living God.

[3] Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O LORD of hosts, my King and my God.

[4] Blessed are those who dwell in your house, ever singing your praise! Selah

[5] Blessed are those whose strength is in you, in whose heart are the highways to Zion.

[6] As they go through the Valley of Baca they make it a place of springs; the early rain also covers it with pools.

[7] They go from strength to strength; each one appears before God in Zion.
