

THE RIGHT AND BLESSING OF REDEMPTION Ruth 4:1-17

I. The Right to Redemption (1-12).

A. The Grace of Redemption (1-8).

Isaiah 54:5: For **your Maker is your husband**, the Lord of hosts is His name; and **your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel**; He is called the God of the whole earth.

Revelation 5:9: And they sang a new song, saying: "You are worthy to take the scroll, and to open its seals; for You were slain, **and have redeemed us to God by Your blood** out of every tribe and tongue and people and nation.

B. The Witnesses of Redemption (9-12).

Acts 1:8: But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and **you shall be witnesses to Me** in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.

Acts 2:32: This Jesus God has raised up, **of which we are all witnesses.**

II. The Blessing of Redemption (13-17).

A. The Blessing on the Son (13-15).

Ephesians 1:12, 14: that we who first trusted in Christ should be **to the praise of His glory**. 14 who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, **to the praise of His glory**.

Jude 25: To God our Savior, who alone is wise, **be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and forever.** Amen.

B. The Blessing on the People (16-17).

Romans 4:6-8: just as David also describes the **blessedness** of the man to whom God imputes righteousness apart from works: "**Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered; blessed is the man to whom the Lord shall not impute sin.**"

Ephesians 1:3: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, **who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ.**
