### Getting Started

1. When have you experienced something that felt unjust?
2. How did it affect the way you prayed and communed with God?

### Digging Deeper

Read Habakkuk 3:16-19.

1. What scenario did the prophet paint in verse 17? How could he choose to rejoice anyway (v. 18)?
2. What was surprising to Habakkuk about the way God acted, positively or negatively? Why was it surprising?
3. How did Habakkuk use the imagery of trees, fields, and flocks to describe the situation in Judah at the time? Why did he use agrarian language?
4. When we choose to trust God in all our circumstances, how will it impact our attitude and actions in difficult times?
5. How can we remember that God is at work even when we don't see signs?
6. In Romans 1:17, Paul quoted Habakkuk 2:4, "The righteous shall live by faith," when he talked about preaching the gospel. Compare and contrast Habakkuk's use of the phrase and Paul's use of it.

### Bringing It Home

1. What circumstances in your life have led you to question God? Who are the people in your life with whom you can share your questions?
2. Habakkuk questioned God about His will and His sovereign plan, but he did not stay in a place of questioning. Is it proper to continually question God in these moments? Why or why not?
3. What are some practical ways believers can keep their eyes on God and not on their circumstances?
