WPC Announcements

Evening Service Tonight: We encourage you to join us for evening worship at 5:30pm. If you cannot attend in person please join us via our livestream. To access the livestream go to our website www.wpc-pca.com and click on livestream.

Nursery Open: The church nursery is now open for Sunday School at 8:45 a.m. and the morning worship service at 10:15 a.m. We are still in need of more volunteers to be able to offer more services and keep the morning nursery open moving forward. WPC nursery serves ages newborn to children 3 years of age.

Covid Protocols: Starting today, June 6th, all COVID protocols will be lifted for all ministries at WPC with the following exceptions:

- The balcony will remain a mask and social distance required space during worship services.
- The overflow seating in the fellowship hall will change to a mask and social distance required space during the worship services.

Outside of these two exceptions, all protocols will be lifted. That means that all pews on the main floor of the worship space will be open and available for seating; we will no longer dismiss row by row; the offering plates will be passed again; the way we serve the Lord's Supper will return to normal; masks will no longer be required of nursery workers; children's and adult Sunday School classes will go back to their former classrooms; and Sunday School start time will revert to 9:00AM.
