Inquirer's Class: Are you considering joining Westminster? New to Reformed theology or Presbyterianism? Looking to get to know the leadership of our church? Come join us for an Inquirer's Class on Sunday mornings, during the Sunday school hour (9-10am) August 7 - September 11. This class will be co-taught by all of our elders and will cover the basics of our church's theology and philosophy of ministry.

Child Protection Policy Annual Renewal Meeting

Attention all Volunteers with youth, children's, and nursery ministries at Westminster,

Our church's Child Protection Policy calls for an annual renewal process to be implemented every August. Part of that process is mandatory instruction and ongoing education in the church's policies and procedures related to all children's and youth ministries.

This meeting is <u>mandatory</u> for all current regular volunteers and for all those interested in becoming regular volunteers with any of our programs that involve children or youth. All volunteers <u>must</u> either attend this meeting <u>or</u> watch the recording before September 1, 2022, in order to maintain their statuses as regular volunteers with any of our children's, youth, or nursery ministries.
