



EPISTLE + 1 CORINTHIANS 11.20-32

A reading from the epistle of blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians.

Brethren: When you come together in one place, it is not to eat the Lord's Supper. For in eating, each one takes his own supper ahead of others; and one is hungry and another is drunk. What! Do you not have houses to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God and shame those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I do not praise you.

For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.

POST COMMUNION COLLECT

O Lord God, who has refreshed us with this life-giving sustenance: we beseech You, that we, who observe the institution of Your Sacrament during our mortal life; may receive from it Your gift of immortality, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever.

Immediately after the Collect, the Dismissal is sung as follows:

THE DISMISSAL

The Lord be with you.

Let us bless the Lord.

Then follows immediately the Repositioning of the Sacrament.

The Repositioning of the Blessed Sacrament

The Celebrant kneels and three times incenses the Sacrament on the main Altar.

After taking a white Humneral Veil, he genuflects before the Sacrament, stands, and takes the Ciborium from the Deacon, covering it with the ends of the veil.

(The Deacon may take the flagon, if both kinds are reserved.)

Then, led by the cross and lighted torches with incense immediately in front of him, and flanked by the Deacon and Subdeacon, the Celebrant takes the Blessed Sacrament to the altar of repose.

When they arrive, one of the assistants lights a sanctuary lamp, and the Sacrament is placed on the altar of repose.

The hymn "Pange Lingua gloriosi" is sung during this solemn and reverent procession.

THE HYMN + PANGE LINGUA GLORIOSI

Now, my tongue, the myst'ry telling Of the glorious Body sing, And the Blood all price excelling, While the Gentiles' Lord and King, Once upon the earth among us dwelling, Shed for this world's ransoming.

Giv'n for us, and condescending

Till He closed with wondrous ending
His most patient life of woe.

That last night at the supper lying Mid the Twelve, His chosen band, Jesus, with the Law complying, Keeps the feasts its rites demand; Then, more precious Food supplying, Gives Himself with His own hand.

Word made Flesh, the bread He taketh, By His Word His Flesh to be; Wine His sacred Blood He maketh, Though the senses fail to see; Faith alone the true heart waketh To behold the mystery.

During the following stanza, the Celebrant, clergy and Faithful genuflect before the Blessed Sacrament.

While kneeling, the Celebrant incenses the Blessed Sacrament throughout the stanza.

Therefore we, before Him bending,
This great Sacrament revere;
Types and shadows have their ending,
For the newer rite is here;
Faith, our outward sense befriending,
Makes our inward vision clear.

All stand and bow.

Glory let us give and blessing
To the Father and the Son,
Honor, thanks and praise addressing,
While eternal ages run;
Ever too His love confessing
Who from Both with Both is One.

After the hymn, a time of silence is kept before the Blessed Sacrament.

At the Celebrant's signal, the clergy stand and move to the main altar for the Stripping of the Altar.

The Stripping of the Altar

The Celebrant and Deacon put on a violet stole while the clergy and servers prepare to strip the Altar.

The Celebrant stands before the Altar and chants the Antiphon plus the first half-verse of the Psalm.

The Cantor (or Celebrant) then chants the entire Psalm, with the Celebrant repeating the Antiphon at the end.

THE SOLEMN LITURGY OF THE PASSION AND DEATH OF OUR LORD

Part One: The Liturgy of the Word

Without incense, cross or torches, the servers silently lead the Celebrant, Deacon and Subdeacon to the Altar.

The servers bow (not genuflect) before the Altar, and then kneel on the pavement.

The Celebrant, Deacon and Subdeacon prostrate before the Altar and pray silently.

Then, at the Celebrant's signal, they kneel.

In monotone, the Celebrant prays the Collect:

THE COLLECT

O God, who by the Passion of Your Christ, Our Lord, destroyed the death of our old sin which all flesh inherited in the Fall:

grant that we, who bear earthly mortality in our bodies;

may, by Your sanctifying grace, be conformed to the image of Your Son and so attain to the likeness of His heavenly life,

through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever.

THE FIRST READING + HOSEA 6.1-6

The Reading is read without introduction.

Come, and let us return to the Lord; For He has torn, but He will heal us; He has stricken, but He will bind us up.

After two days He will revive us; On the third day He will raise us up, That we may live in His sight.

Let us know,

Let us pursue the knowledge of the Lord. His going forth is established as the morning; He will come to us like the rain, Like the latter and former rain to the earth.

"O Ephraim, what shall I do to you?
O Judah, what shall I do to you?
For your faithfulness is like a morning cloud,
And like the early dew it goes away.

Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets, I have slain them by the words of My mouth; And your judgments are like light that goes forth.

For I desire mercy and not sacrifice, And the knowledge of God more than burnt offerings."

THE SECOND READING + EXODUS 12.1-11

The Reading is read without introduction.

In those days the Lord spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying, "This month shall be your beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year to you.

"Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying: 'On the tenth day of this month every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of his father, a lamb for a household. And if the household is too small for the lamb, let him and his neighbor next to his house take it according to the number of the persons; according to each man's need you shall make your count for the lamb. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats. Now you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month. Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight. And they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it. Then they shall eat the flesh on that night; roasted in fire, with unleavened bread and with bitter herbs they shall eat it. Do not eat it raw, nor boiled at all with water, but roasted in fire—its head with its legs and its entrails. You shall let none of it remain until morning, and what remains of it until morning you shall burn with fire. And thus you shall eat it: with a belt on your waist, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. So you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover."

The Passion Narrative is read without Salutation or the usual liturgical introduction and response.

THE PASSION NARRATIVE + ST. JOHN 18.1-19.42

N: The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint John.

The congregation is seated.

- N: When Jesus had spoken these words, He went out with His disciples over the Brook Kidron, where there was a garden, which He and His disciples entered. And Judas, who betrayed Him, also knew the place; for Jesus often met there with His disciples. Then Judas, having received a detachment of troops, and officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, came there with lanterns, torches, and weapons. Jesus therefore, knowing all things that would come upon Him, went forward and said to them,
- +: "Whom are you seeking?"
- N: They answered Him,
- **C:** "Jesus of Nazareth."
- N: Jesus said to them,
- +: "I am He."
- N: And Judas, who betrayed Him, also stood with them. Then--when He said to them, "I am He,"--they drew back and fell to the ground. Then He asked them again,
- +: "Whom are you seeking?"
- N: And they said,
- **C:** "Jesus of Nazareth."
- N: Jesus answered,
- +: "I have told you that I am He. Therefore, if you seek Me, let these go their way,"
- N: that the saying might be fulfilled which He spoke, "Of those whom You gave Me I have lost none." Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus. Then Jesus said to Peter,
- +: "Put your sword into the sheath. Shall I not drink the cup which My Father has given Me?"
- N: Then the detachment of troops and the captain and the officers of the Jews arrested Jesus and bound Him. And they led Him away to Annas first, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas who was high priest that year. Now it was Caiaphas who gave counsel to the Jews that it was expedient that one man should die for the people. And Simon Peter followed

Jesus, and so did another disciple. Now that disciple was known to the high priest, and went with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest. But Peter stood at the door outside. Then the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out and spoke to her who kept the door, and brought Peter in. Then the servant girl who kept the door said to Peter,

- C: "You are not also one of this Man's disciples, are you?"
- N: He said,
- C: "I am not."
- N: And the servants and officers who had made a fire of coals stood there, for it was cold, and they warmed themselves. And Peter stood with them and warmed himself. The high priest then asked Jesus about His disciples and His doctrine. Jesus answered him,
- +: "I spoke openly to the world. I always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where the Jews always meet, and in secret I have said nothing. Why do you ask Me? Ask those who have heard Me what I said to them. Indeed they know what I said."
- N: And when He had said these things, one of the officers who stood by struck Jesus with the palm of his hand, saying,
- C: "Do You answer the high priest like that?"
- N: Jesus answered him,
- +: "If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil; but if well, why do you strike Me?"
- N: Then Annas sent Him bound to Caiaphas the high priest. Now Simon Peter stood and warmed himself. Therefore they said to him,
- C: "You are not also one of His disciples, are you?"
- N: He denied it and said,
- C: "I am not!"
- N: One of the servants of the high priest, a relative of him whose ear Peter cut off, said,
- C: "Did I not see you in the garden with Him?"
- N: Peter then denied again; and immediately a rooster crowed. Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium, and it was early morning. But they themselves did not go into the Praetorium, lest they should be defiled, but that they might eat the Passover. Pilate then went out to them and said,
- C: "What accusation do you bring against this Man?"
- N: They answered and said to him,
- c: "If He were not an evildoer, we would not have delivered Him up to you."
- N: Then Pilate said to them,
- C: "You take Him and judge Him according to your law."
- N: Therefore the Jews said to him,
- C: "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death,"
- N: that the saying of Jesus might be fulfilled which He spoke, signifying by what death He would die. Then Pilate entered the Praetorium again, called Jesus, and said to Him,
- **C:** "Are You the King of the Jews?"
- N: Jesus answered him,
- +: "Are you speaking for yourself on this, or did others tell you this about Me?"
- N: Pilate answered,

- C: "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered You to me. What have You done?"
- N: Jesus answered,
- +: "My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would fight, so that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but now My kingdom is not from here."
- N: Pilate therefore said to Him,
- C: "Are You a king then?"
- N: Jesus answered,
- +: "You say rightly that I am a king. For this cause I was born, and for this cause I have come into the world, that I should bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice."
- N: Pilate said to Him,
- **C:** "What is truth?"
- N: And when he had said this, he went out again to the Jews, and said to them,
- **C:** "I find no fault in Him at all. But you have a custom that I should release someone to you at the Passover. Do you therefore want me to release to you the King of the Jews?"
- N: Then they all cried again, saying,
- C: "Not this Man, but Barabbas!"
- N: Now Barabbas was a robber. So then Pilate took Jesus and scourged Him. And the soldiers twisted a crown of thorns and put it on His head, and they put on Him a purple robe. Then they said,
- C: "Hail, King of the Jews!"
- N: And they struck Him with their hands. Pilate then went out again, and said to them,
- c: "Behold, I am bringing Him out to you, that you may know that I find no fault in Him."
- N: Then Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. And Pilate said to them,
- **C:** "Behold the Man!"
- N: Therefore, when the chief priests and officers saw Him, they cried out, saying,
- **C:** "Crucify Him, crucify Him!"
- N: Pilate said to them,
- C: "You take Him and crucify Him, for I find no fault in Him."
- N: The Jews answered him,
- **C:** "We have a law, and according to our law He ought to die, because He made Himself the Son of God."
- N: Therefore, when Pilate heard that saying, he was the more afraid, and went again into the Praetorium, and said to Jesus,
- **C:** "Where are You from?"
- N: But Jesus gave him no answer. Then Pilate said to Him,
- **C:** "Are You not speaking to me? Do You not know that I have power to crucify You, and power to release You?"
- N: Jesus answered,

- +: "You could have no power at all against Me unless it had been given you from above. Therefore the one who delivered Me to you has the greater sin."
- N: From then on Pilate sought to release Him, but the Jews cried out, saying,
- **C:** "If you let this Man go, you are not Caesar's friend. Whoever makes himself a king speaks against Caesar."
- N: When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus out and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called The Pavement, but in Hebrew, Gabbatha. Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he said to the Jews,
- **C:** "Behold your King!"
- N: But they cried out,
- C: "Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!"
- N: Pilate said to them,
- **C:** "Shall I crucify your King?"
- N: The chief priests answered,
- **C:** "We have no king but Caesar!"
- N: So he delivered Him to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus and led Him away. And He, bearing His cross, went out to a place called the Place of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha, where they crucified Him, and two others with Him, one on either side, and Jesus in the center. Now Pilate wrote a title and put it on the cross. And the writing was: Jesus of Nazareth, The King of the Jews. Then many of the Jews read this title, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin. Then the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate,
- c: "Do not write, `The King of the Jews,' but, `He said, "I am the King of the Jews.""
- N: Pilate answered,
- **C:** "What I have written, I have written."
- N: Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took His garments and made four parts, to each soldier a part, and also the tunic. Now the tunic was without seam, woven from the top in one piece. They said therefore among themselves,
- C: "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be,"
- N: that the Scripture might be fulfilled which says: "They divided My garments among them, and for My clothing they cast lots." Therefore the soldiers did these things. Now there stood by the cross of Jesus His mother, and His mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing by, He said to His mother,
- +: "Woman, behold your son!"
- N: Then He said to the disciple,
- +: "Behold your mother!"
- N: And from that hour that disciple took her to his own home. After this, Jesus, knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said,
- +: "I thirst!"
- N: Now a vessel full of sour wine was sitting there; and they filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on hyssop, and put it to His mouth. So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said,
- +: "It is finished!"
- N: And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit.

All kneel silently to the Altar Cross.

Therefore, because it was the Preparation Day, that the bodies should not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away. Then the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who was crucified with Him. But when they came to Jesus and saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs. But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out. And he who has seen has testified, and his testimony is true; and he knows that he is telling the truth, so that you may believe. For these things were done that the Scripture should be fulfilled, "Not one of His bones shall be broken." And again another Scripture says, "They shall look on Him whom they pierced." After this, Joseph of Arimathea, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly, for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus; and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took the body of Jesus. And Nicodemus, who at first came to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pounds. Then they took the body of Jesus, and bound it in strips of linen with the spices, as the custom of the Jews is to bury. Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. So there they laid Jesus, because of the Jews' Preparation Day, for the tomb was nearby.

The Chief Hymn is "A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth" (TLH #142).

During the Chief Hymn, in preparation for the Solemn Prayers, the Celebrant puts on a black cope and the Deacon and Subdeacon vest in black. In addition, a white linen cloth is spread on the Altar.

Part Two: The Solemn Prayers

After the Chief Hymn, the Celebrant reverences the Altar with a kiss and then begins the Solemn Prayers.

FOR THE HOLY CHURCH

Almighty and everlasting God, who hast revealed Your glory to all nations in Jesus Christ and the Word of His truth:

we beseech You to guard the works of Your mercy;

so that Your Church, spread throughout all nations, may serve You in true faith and persevere in the confession of Your name,

through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

FOR THE BISHOPS AND OUR PASTOR

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Let us pray for our Synodical Bishop, Nn.; for our own Bishop, Nn.; and for me, your unworthy servant; that our God and Lord, who has called us to these holy offices, would keep us in health and safety for the good of His holy Church and the welfare of His holy people.

Let us pray.

The Deacon sings:

Let us kneel.

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

Let us stand.

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, whose judgment upholds all things in heaven and on earth: mercifully hear our prayers for those who govern us according to Your holy Word; that they may be defended from all adversities, and that Your Christian people may prosper under their care and bring forth the fruits of faith, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

FOR ALL THE CLERGY AND THE FAITHFUL

one God, now and forever.

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Let us pray for all bishops, pastors, deacons and subdeacons; for all acoyltes, exorcists, readers, and doorkeepers; for all confessors, virgins and widows; and for all God's holy people.

Let us pray.

The Deacon sings:

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified:

receive the supplications and prayers which we offer before You for all estates of men in Your holy Church;

that every member of the same, in his vocation and ministry, may truly and godly serve You, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

FOR THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Let us pray for all heads of government and for all who assist them and have positions of authority, that our God and Lord would direct their hearts and minds to conform to His will so that we may live in peace.

Let us pray.

The Deacon sings:

Let us kneel.

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

Let us stand.

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, in whose hand dwells all the might of man, and who has ordained the powers that exist for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of those who do well:

graciously regard those who govern our nation;

that all who receive the sword as Your ministers may bear it according to Your commandment, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

FOR THE CATECHUMENS

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Let us pray for our catechumens, that our God and Lord would open the ears of their hearts and the gate of His mercy, so that by the waters of Holy Baptism they may receive forgiveness of their sins and abide in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

The Deacon sings:

Let us kneel.

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

Let us stand.

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, who always multiplies Your Church, and with Your light and grace strengthens the hearts of those whom You have regenerated:

grant unto our catechumens increase both of faith and knowledge;

that they may rejoice in their Baptism and be numbered among the sons of Your adoption, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

FOR THE NEEDS OF THE FAITHFUL

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Dearly beloved, let us pray that God the Father almighty would cleanse the world from all false doctrine, banish disease, and drive away famine; deliver prisoners and liberate captives; and grant safe return to all travelers, health to the sick, and shelter to those in distress.

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

Let us stand.

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, who desires that none should perish, but that all be saved: mercifully look upon those who are led astray by the deceits of the devil;

that they may repent and turn from their evil, and be restored to the way of truth and the unity of Your holy Church,

through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

FOR THE CONVERSION OF THE JEWS

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Let us pray for unbelieving Jews, that our God and Lord would remove the veil of unbelief from their hearts, so that they also may confess Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Let us pray.

The Deacon sings:

Let us kneel.

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

Let us stand.

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, who extends to the unbelieving Jews Your abundant mercy: graciously hear our prayers for those whose hearts are blinded;

that acknowledging Jesus Christ, who is the Light of truth, they may be delivered from their darkness,

through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

FOR THE CONVERSION OF THE UNBELIEVERS

The Celebrant sings the bid.

Let us pray for all unbelievers, that almighty God would take away the iniquity of their hearts, so that they turn from their false gods and be converted to the living and true God and to His only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our God and Lord.

Let us pray.

The Deacon sings:

Let us kneel.

After a silent prayer the Deacon sings:

Let us stand.

The Celebrant prays the Collect.

Almighty and everlasting God, who desires not the death of a sinner, but that he should turn from his wickedness and live:

mercifully hear our prayers for those who have no right knowledge of the Gospel of Your Son; that they may be delivered from their idolatrous worship and gathered into Your holy Church, to the honor and glory of Your name,

through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

Part Three: The Veneration of the Holy Cross

During the following hymn, the Celebrant, Deacon and Subdeacon remove their black vestments.

Then the veiled cross is brought by the Deacon into the midst of the sanctuary.

Torches or lighted candles may accompany the cross.



After the cross has been unveiled, it is placed in position for the Veneration.

Candles may be set on either side of the cross.

The Celebrant first venerates the cross by genuflecting (three times) before it, and then kissing the feet of the corpus.

The other clergy, from highest dignity to lowest, venerate the cross in the same manner.

Then the Faithful are invited to venerate the cross.

While the cross is venerated, the Reproaches are sung.





Part Four: Holy Communion

THE PROCESSION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

The Celebrant, Deacon and Subdeacon put on the usual black Eucharistic vestments.

The Altar is prepared with corporal, burse, and missal.

After the Altar is ready, the Blessed Sacrament (accompanied by lighted candles) is brought from the place of reposition to the Altar by the Deacon. (The candles are then placed on the altar.)

While the Sacrament is processed, the following verses are chanted:



We adore You, O Christ, and we | bless You

Because by Your holy cross, You | have redeemed the world.

By a tree we were made slaves, and by the holy cross we | are set free:

The fruit of the tree seduced us, the Son of God | has redeemed us.

Savior of the world, | save us:

Help us, we beseech You, Our God, who has redeemed us | by Your cross and blood.

THE VERBA CHRISTI

After the Altar is prepared, using a simple tone, the Celebrant chants the Words of Our Lord's Last Will and Testament.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had ble\(^*\)ssed and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said:

Take, eat;

THIS IS MY BODY,

which is given for you. This do in remembrance of me.

Genuflect, elevate (no bells are rung), genuflect.

In the same way also, He took the cup after supper, and when He had given ♥ thanks, He gave it to them saying:

Drink of it, all of you;

THIS IS MY BLOOD

of the New Testament, which is shed for you for the remission of sins. This do as often as you drink it in remembrance of me.

Genuflect, elevate (no bells are rung), genuflect.

THE PATER NOSTER

As Our Savior Christ has commanded and taught us, we are bold to say:

The Our Father is chanted in monotone.

Our Father who art in heaven. Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from evil. Amen

THE EMBOLISM

Deliver us, O Lord, we beseech You:

from every evil past, present and to come;

and at the intercession of the blessed and glorious ever Virgin Mary, Mother of God, your blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and with Andrew, and all the Saints,

THE DISTRIBUTION OF OUR LORD'S BODY AND BLOOD

The Celebrant distributes the Most Blessed Sacrament to those who desire to receive it. He begins with those in the chancel, proceeds to the infirm, and then communes those other eligible communicants who present themselves.

During the Communion, a Hymn (or Hymns) may be sung.

When the vessels are cleansed and the altar cleared, the Celebrant signals the people to stand.

POST-COMMUNION COLLECTS

All sung in monotone.

The clergy descend from the Altar, genuflect, and depart silently to the sacristy.

May He guard;

And preserve us;

Christ the Lord. Amen

Lighting the Candle, he says:

May the Light of Christ, risen in glory from the dead, scatter all the darkness of our hearts and minds.

Then the Celebrant blesses the lighted Candle, saying:

The Lord be with you.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, the unseen regenerator of all things:

pour out, we beseech You, the abundance of Your bless ing on this candle, that it may be a light to lighten our darkness;

so that this Paschal sacrifice may be illumined by the presence of Your light,

and wherever this sacred mystery is celebrated, the power of Your majesty may drive out all the deceits and assaults of the devil,

through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord;

who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit:

one God, now and forever.

PROCESSION OF THE PASCAL CANDLE

The candles of the Faithful are lit from the Paschal Candle.
All the lights in the church are turned off.

The Deacon, holding the Paschal Candle high, leads the procession to the Chancel.

At the beginning of the procession, the Deacon chants:







This is the paschal feast in which the true lamb is slain; whose blood hallowed the doorposts of the faithful. This is the night on which you bought our forefathers, the children of Israel, dry-shod through the Read Sea in the flight from Egypt. This is the night on which the light of the pillar of fire destroyed the darkness of sin. This is the night which at this hour ev'rywhere restores to grace and unites in holiness those who believe in Christ, separating them from worldly vice and the darkness of sin. This is the night on which Christ burst the bonds of death and victoriously arose from the grave. For life itself, without redemption, would be of no avail to us. O wondrous condescension of Your mercy towards us! How far beyond our understanding is Your loving affection that You should ransom a slave at the price of Your Son. O necessary sin of Adam, which was blotted out by the death of Christ. O happy fault, that merited such a redeemer. O truly blessed night which alone deserved to know the time and the hour when Christ arose from the grave. It is of this night that Scripture says: "And the night shall be as bright as day. And the night shall light up my joy." The holiness of this night banishes wickedness and washes away sin and restores innocence to those who have fallen. It puts hatred to flight, brings peace and humbles pride. Therefore, O holy Father, accept on this night the evening sacrifice of fire which Your holy Church presents to You by the hands of her ministers in the solemn offering of this candle of wax made by bees. For now we see the splendor of this pillar which the shining flame enkindles to the glory of God. A flame not dimmed, even though divided into parts, because it is nourished by the melting wax produced by the parent bee to form the substance of this precious lamp. O truly blessed night which despoiled the Egyptians and enriched the Hebrews. O night on which heaven is united to earth and the divine brought to the human. Therefore, O Lord, we pray that this candle, consecrated in honor of Your name, may endlessly continue to scatter the darkness of this night. May it be received as a sweet fragrance and mingle with the lights of heaven. May that Morning Star which never sets—He who came back from the grave and shed His serene light upon mankind—find its flame still burning. Grant us, Your servants, O Lord, and all Your clergy and faithful people, together with our Synodical Bishop Nn. and our Bishop Nn. a season of peace during this time of Easter joy; and govern, rule and preserve us with Your constant protection. Also look upon those who rule over us and, in Your ineffable pity and mercy, direct their thoughts towards justice and peace so that, with all Your people, they may one day arrive in our heavenly country, leaving behind them the cares of this world; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You in communion with the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Service of Readings

FIRST PROPHECY + GENESIS 1.1-2.2

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form, and void; and darkness was on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good; and God divided the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the evening and the morning were the first day.

Then God said, "Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters." Thus God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament; and it was so. And God called the firmament Heaven. So the evening and the morning were the second day.

Then God said, "Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear"; and it was so. And God called the dry land Earth, and the gathering together of the waters He called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb that yields seed, and the fruit tree that yields fruit according to its kind, whose seed is in itself, on the earth"; and it was so. And the earth brought forth grass, the herb that yields seed according to its kind, and the tree that yields fruit, whose seed is in itself according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. So the evening and the morning were the third day.

Then God said, "Let there be lights in the firmament of the heavens to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs and seasons, and for days and years; and let them be for lights in the firmament of the heavens to give light on the earth"; and it was so. Then God made two great lights: the greater light to rule the day, and the lesser light to rule the night. He made the stars also. God set them in the firmament of the heavens to give light on the earth, and to rule over the day and over the night, and to divide the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. So the evening and the morning were the fourth day.

Then God said, "Let the waters abound with an abundance of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the face of the firmament of the heavens." So God created great sea creatures and every living thing that moves, with which the waters abounded, according to their kind, and every winged bird according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." So the evening and the morning were the fifth day.

Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth the living creature according to its kind: cattle and creeping thing and beast of the earth, each according to its kind"; and it was so. And God made the beast of the earth according to its kind, cattle according to its kind, and everything that creeps on the earth according to its kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

And God said, "See, I have given you every herb that yields seed which is on the face of all the earth, and every tree whose fruit yields seed; to you it shall be for food. Also, to every beast of the earth, to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, in which there is life, I have given every green herb for food"; and it was so. Then God saw everything that He had made, and indeed it was very good. So the evening and the morning were the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth, and all the host of them, were finished. And on the seventh

day God ended His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done.

Let us pray. Let us kneel.

O God, who in a wondrous manner created the human race and still more wondrously redeemed the same: mercifully grant, we beseech You; that we may be conformed to the image of Your Son who came to share our humanity, through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord; who lives and reigns with You in communion with the Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever.

The Faithful are seated.

SECOND PROPHECY + EXODUS 14.10-15.1

In those days, when Pharaoh drew near, the children of Israel lifted their eyes, and behold, the Egyptians marched after them. So they were very afraid, and the children of Israel cried out to the Lord.

Then they said to Moses, "Because there were no graves in Egypt, have you taken us away to die in the wilderness? Why have you so dealt with us, to bring us up out of Egypt? Is this not the word that we told you in Egypt, saying, 'Let us alone that we may serve the Egyptians?' For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than that we should die in the wilderness."

And Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which He will accomplish for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall see again no more forever. The Lord will fight for you, and you shall hold your peace."

And the Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry to Me? Tell the children of Israel to go forward. But lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it. And the children of Israel shall go on dry ground through the midst of the sea. And I indeed will harden the hearts of the Egyptians, and they shall follow them. So I will gain honor over Pharaoh and over all his army, his chariots, and his horsemen. Then the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I have gained honor for Myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his horsemen."

And the Angel of God, who went before the camp of Israel, moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud went from before them and stood behind them. So it came between the camp of the Egyptians and the camp of Israel. Thus it was a cloud and darkness to the one, and it gave light by night to the other, so that the one did not come near the other all that night.

Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that night, and made the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. So the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea on the dry ground, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. And the Egyptians pursued and went after them into the midst of the sea, all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen.

Now it came to pass, in the morning watch, that the Lord looked down upon the army of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and cloud, and He troubled the army of the Egyptians. And He took off their chariot wheels, so that they drove them with difficulty; and the Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the face of Israel, for the Lord fights for them against the Egyptians."

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the waters may come back upon the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen." And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and when the morning appeared, the sea returned to its full depth, while the Egyptians were fleeing into it. So the Lord overthrew the Egyptians in the midst of the sea. Then the waters returned and covered the chariots, the horsemen, and all the army of Pharaoh that came into the sea after them. Not so much as one of them remained. But the children of Israel had walked on dry land in the midst of the sea, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left.

So the Lord saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians

dead on the seashore. Thus Israel saw the great work which the Lord had done in Egypt; so the people feared the Lord, and believed the Lord and His servant Moses.

And it shall come to pass that he who is left in Zion and remains in Jerusalem will be called holy—everyone who is recorded among the living in Jerusalem. When the Lord has washed away the filth of the daughters of Zion, and purged the blood of Jerusalem from her midst, by the spirit of judgment and by the spirit of burning, then the Lord will create above every dwelling place of Mount Zion, and above her assemblies, a cloud and smoke by day and the shining of a flaming fire by night. For over all the glory there will be a covering. And there will be a tabernacle for shade in the daytime from the heat, for a place of refuge, and for a shelter from storm and rain.

If today, while I am yet alive with you, you have been rebellious against the Lord, then how much more after my death? Gather to me all the elders of your tribes, and your officers, that I may speak these words in their hearing and call heaven and earth to witness against them. and You are also ready tô hëar our prayers.

O God, in the very beginning of the world Your Spirit moved over the waters; and gave the element of water the power to sanctify.

O God, by water You also washed away the sinfulness of a guilty world;

And by the Flood You prefigured our regeneration;

so that, in a mystery, one and the same water drowns sin and gives birth to gödliness.

May You, O Lord, who fill your city with joy by the flowing torrent of Your grace; look mercifully upon Your Church and multiply Your acts of regeneration within her.

may human nature created in Your likeness and recreated in Your glory, be cleansed from all the defilement of man;

so that everyone who receives this Sacrament rebirth, may be born again as a child of gödly innocence;

After the blessing of Baptismal waters, the basin is carried in procession to the font. At the same time, altar candles are lit.

When there are baptismal candidates, the Sacrament of Holy Baptism is administered.







Seeing that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

For every high priest taken from among men is appointed for men in things pertaining to God, that he may offer both gifts and sacrifices for sins. He can have compassion on those who are ignorant and going astray, since he himself is also subject to weakness. Because of this he is required as for the people, so also for himself, to offer sacrifices for sins. And no man takes this honor to himself, but he who is called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who said to Him: "You are My Son,

Today I have begotten You."

As He also says in another place:

"You are a priest forever

According to the order of Melchizedek";

who, in the days of His flesh, when He had offered up prayers and supplications, with vehement cries and tears to Him who was able to save Him from death, and was heard because of His godly fear, though He was a Son, yet He learned obedience by the things which He suffered. And having been perfected, He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him.
