



But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him. And He said to them, "What kind of conversation is this that you have with one another as you walk and are sad?" Then the one whose name was Cleopas answered and said to Him, "Are You the only stranger in Jerusalem, and have You not known the things which happened there in these days?" And He said to them, "What things?" So they said to Him, "The things concerning Jesus of Nazareth, who was a Prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to be condemned to death, and crucified Him. But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, today is the third day since these things happened. Yes, and certain women of our company, who arrived at the tomb early, astonished us. When they did not find His body, they came saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said He was alive. And certain of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but Him they did not see." Then He said to them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?" And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself. Then they drew near to the village where they were going, and He indicated that He would have gone farther. But they constrained Him, saying, "Abide with us, for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent." And He went in to stay with them. Now it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, that He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they knew Him; and He vanished from their sight. And they said to one another, "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the Scriptures to us?" So they rose up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found the eleven and those who were with them gathered together, saying, "The Lord is risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!" GOSPEL + ST. JOHN 21.1-14

The Lord be with you.

The continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. John.

At that time Jesus showed Himself again to the disciples at the Sea of Tiberias, and in this way He showed Himself: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of His disciples were together.

Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We are going with you also." They went out and immediately got into the boat, and that night they caught nothing.

But when the morning had now come, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Then Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any food?" They answered Him, "No." And He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast, and now they were not able to draw it in because of the multitude of fish. Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment (for he had removed it), and plunged into the sea. But the other disciples came in the little boat (for they were not far from land, but about two hundred cubits), dragging the net with fish.

Then, as soon as they had come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish which you have just caught." Simon Peter went up and dragged the net to land, full of large fish, one hundred and fifty-three; and although there were so many, the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, "Come and eat breakfast." Yet none of the disciples dared ask Him, "Who are You?"—knowing that it was the Lord. Jesus then came and took the bread and gave it to them, and likewise the fish.

This is now the third time Jesus showed Himself to His disciples after He was raised from the dead.

And behold, a man of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority under Candace the queen of the Ethiopians, who had charge of all her treasury, and had come to Jerusalem to worship, was returning. And sitting in his chariot, he was reading Isaiah the prophet. Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go near and overtake this chariot." So Philip ran to him, and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah, and said, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he asked Philip to come up and sit with him. What hinders me from being baptized?" Then Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he answered and said, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him. Now when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught Philip away, so that the eunuch saw him no more; and he went on his way rejoicing. But Philip was found at Azotus. And passing through, he preached in all the cities till he came to Caesarea.

★ At that time Mary stood outside by the tomb weeping, and as she wept she stooped down and looked into the tomb. And she saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain. Then they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "Because they have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him."

THE INVOCATION

In the Name of the Father and of the 🖲 Son and of the Holy Spirit.

THE CONFIRMATION ADDRESS

The Celebrant turns and addresses the Faithful:

Beloved in the Lord: Our Lord Jesus Christ said: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to heed everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age."

The Celebrant addresses the Catechumens:

Catechumens: You have been baptized. And you have been taught the Faith according to Our Lord's bidding. The fulfillment of His bidding we now celebrate with thankful hearts, rejoicing to confess the Faith into which you were baptized and which you yourselves will now confess before the holy Church.

Jesus said, "Whoever confesses Me before men, I will also confess him before My Father in heaven. But He that denies Me before me, I will deny him before My Father in heaven."

Lift up you hearts, therefore, to the God of all grace. And joyfully give answer to that which I, in the name of the Lord as a minister of His Church, shall now ask you.

THE CONFESSION OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH

Do you this day, in the presence of God and this congregation, acknowledge the gifts which God gave you in your Baptism? If so say, I do.

Do you renounce the devil? If so say, I renounce.

Do you renounce all his works? If so say, I renounce.

Do you renounce all his ways? If so say, I renounce.

Do you believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth? If so say, I believe.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead? If so say, I believe.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting? If so say, I believe.

Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church, and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it? If so say, I do so intend with the help of God.

Do you hold all the prophetic and apostolic Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God? And do you confess the doctrine of the Evangelical-Lutheran Church drawn from them, as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism, to be faithful and true? If so say, I do.

Do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the Divine Word, to be faithful in the use of God's Word and Sacraments, and in faith, word and action to remain true to God: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, even to death? If so say, I do so intend by the grace of God.

Give then your hand as a pledge of your promise, and kneel to receive His blessing.

THE LAYING ON OF HANDS AND ANOINTING WITH SACRED CHRISM

The Catechumens kneel individually to receive the blessing.

During the blessing, the Celebrant anoints each Catechumen on the forehead with Sacred Chrism.

NN., Almighty God, the Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, who has begotten you of water and the Holy Spirit, and forgiven you all your sins, renew and increase in you His Holy Spirit, the Comforter, with His sevenfold gifts:

The Spirit of wisdom and understanding;

The Spirit of counsel and might;

The Spirit of knowledge and piety; and

The Spirit of the fear of the Lord.

THE CONFIRMATION MEMORIAL

The Celebrant speaks a Scripture passage in blessing over the Catechumen.

THE STRIKING ON THE CHEEK

The Celebrant gives a light slap to the Catechumen, while saying:

"Do not be surprised if the world hates you. You know that it hated Me before it hated you." (St. John 15.18)

THE BLESSING

The almighty and most merciful God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, bless and defend you.

THE SACRAMENT OF ORDINATION

The candidate presents himself before the altar. The Officiant, standing before the altar, says:



The minister addresses the congregation:

Beloved in the Lord, Reverend Seminarist James Andrew Childs has been called by the Lord of the Church into the office of the holy ministry of the Word and Sacraments. He has prepared himself for this ministry by careful study and prayer. He has been examined and declared ready and prepared to undertake this sacred responsibility and, by the guidance of God the Holy Spirit, he has in the Church's usual order been called to be Pastor of Christ Evangelical-Lutheran Church in Mason City, Illinois. According to apostolic practice, he is now presented to be ordained and consecrated to this office established by God.

The candidate kneels. The Officiant chants or says:





Al-le - lu - ia, al- le- lu- ia.

The hymn "Come, Holy Ghost, Our Souls Inspire" is sung. The Salutation and Collect are chanted or said.



The Lord be with you.

And with your spirit.

Let us pray.

O God, who taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending to them the Light of Your Holy Spirit:

grant us by the same Spirit to have a right judgment in all things; and evermore to rejoice in His holy comfort, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord; who lives and reigns with You, in the unity of the same Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever.

Amen

The ministers and candidate remain standing while the congregation is seated.

The Officiant turns to the candidate and says:

Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the institution of the office of the holy ministry.

Assisting ministers read one or more portions of Holy Scripture from each of the following sections.

THE INSTITUTION OF THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age." (*Matt. 28:18–20*)

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent Me, I am sending you." And with that He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:21–23)

Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the responsibilities of the office of the holy ministry.

THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you truly love Me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "You know that I love You." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you truly love Me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, You know that I love You." Jesus said, "Take care of My sheep." The third time He said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love Me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love Me?" He said, "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep." *(John 21:15–17)*

[Jesus] told them, "This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem." (*Luke 24:46–47*)

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "This is My body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same way, after supper He took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of Me." (*1 Cor. 11:23–25*)

Do not neglect your gift, which was given you through a prophetic message when the body of elders laid their hands on you. Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress. Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers. *(1 Tim. 4:14–16)*

So then, men ought to regard us as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the secret things of God. Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful. (1 Cor. 4:1–2)

Such confidence as this is ours through Christ before God. Not that we are competent to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God. (2 Cor. 3:4–5)

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! All this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And He has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God. (2 Cor. 5:17–21)

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of His appearing and His kingdom, I give you this charge: Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction. For the

Easter

time will come when men will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry. (2 *Tim. 4:1–5*)

Here is a trustworthy saying: If anyone sets his heart on being an overseer, he desires a noble task. Now the overseer must be above reproach, the husband of but one wife, temperate, self-controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, not given to much wine, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage his own family well and see that his children obey him with proper respect. (If anyone does not know how to manage his own family, how can he take care of God's church?) He must not be a recent convert, or he may become conceited and fall under the same judgment as the devil. He must also have a good reputation with outsiders, so that he will not fall into disgrace and into the devil's trap. (*1 Tim. 3:1–7*)

It was He who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up. *(Epb. 4:11–12)*

[Guard] yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which He bought with His own blood. (Acts 20:28)

Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, serving as overseers—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not greedy for money, but eager to serve; not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away. *(1 Peter 5:2–4)*

Hear what Holy Scripture says concerning the strength and promise God gives to those in the office of the holy ministry.

THE STRENGTH AND PROMISE IN THE OFFICE OF THE HOLY MINISTRY

[Jesus said:] "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled by men. You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." (*Matt. 5:13–16*)

"Let him who boasts boast in the Lord." For it is not the one who commends himself who is approved, but the one whom the Lord commends. (2 Cor. 10:17–18)

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2 Tim. 3:14–17)

The Officiant addresses the candidate:

Dear brother in Christ, the Lord grant that you receive and keep these words in your heart that you may be strengthened and encouraged in your labors.

God gathers His Church by and around His Holy Gospel, and thereby also grants it growth and increase according to His good pleasure. That this may be done, He has established the office of the holy ministry into which you have been called by the Church and are now to be ordained and consecrated by prayer and the laying on of hands.

In the presence of this congregation and before our Lord God to whom you must give account now and at the Last Day, I now ask you:

Do you acknowledge that the Lord has called you through His Church into the ministry of Word and Sacrament?

I do.

Do you believe and confess the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice?

Yes, I believe and confess the canonical Scriptures to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice.

Do you believe and confess the three Ecumenical Creeds, namely the Apostolic, the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds, as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors which they condemn?

Yes, I believe and confess the three Creeds because they are in accord with the Word of God. I also reject all the errors they condemn.

Do you confess the Unaltered Augsburg Confession to be a true exposition of Holy Scripture and a correct exhibition of the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church? And do you confess that the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Small and Large Catechisms of Martin Luther, the Smalcald Articles, the Treatise on the Authority and Primacy of the Pope, and the Formula of Concord—as these are contained in the 1580 Book of Concord—are also in agreement with this one scriptural faith?

Yes, I make these Confessions my own because they are in accord with the Word of God.

Do you promise that you will perform the duties of your office in accordance with these Confessions, and that all your preaching and teaching and your administration of the Sacraments will be in conformity with Holy Scripture and with these Confessions?

Yes, I promise with the help of God.

Will you faithfully instruct both young and old in the chief articles of Christian doctrine, will you forgive the sins of those who repent, and will you promise never to divulge the sins confessed to you? Will you minister faithfully to the sick and dying, will you demonstrate to the Church a constant and ready ministry centered in the Gospel? Will you admonish and encourage the people to a lively confidence in Christ and in holy living?

Yes, I will with the help of God.

Finally, will you honor and adorn the office of the holy ministry with a holy life? Will you be diligent in study of Holy Scripture and the Confessions? And will you be constant in prayer for those under your pastoral care?

I will, the Lord helping me through the power and grace of His Holy Spirit.

The candidate kneels. The Officiant lays both his hands directly on the head of the candidate and says:

[Jesus said:] "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent Me, I am sending you." And with that He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

While the church bell is rung, the Officiant says clearly, slowly, and distinctly:

James Andrew Childs, I ordain and consecrate you to the office of the holy ministry of the Word and Sacraments in the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, in the name of the Father and of the X Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Lord Jesus pour out on you His Holy Spirit for this office and work that you may faithfully preach the Gospel and administer the Sacraments. Amen.

The assisting pastors each in turn lay both their hands directly on the newly ordained, adding an appropriate blessing or passage from the Word of God.

The assisting pastors together with the Officiant may jointly lay hands on the newly ordained while the congregation prays the Lord's Prayer:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

The newly ordained stands and is vested with a stole; he may also be vested with a chasuble.

The minister and the newly ordained turn to face the congregation. The minister says:

Holy Scripture says, "Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you." (Heb. 13:17 ESV). Will you, the faithful, according to the Church's public confession, and speaking for the whole Church, receive Reverend Father James Andrew Childs as a servant of Christ and minister of Word and Sacrament? If so, answer: We will.

We will.

The congregation stands. The ministers and the newly ordained may kneel. The Officiant prays.

O eternal, merciful God, You have spoken through Your own dear Son, saying that the harvest is plentiful but the laborers few and that we should ask You, the Lord of the harvest, to send laborers into Your harvest. Hear now our prayer on behalf of him who this day is ordained and consecrated to be Your minister in the Church. Strengthen him mightily to take up the Word of truth and faithfully to administer Your holy Sacraments.

O Lord Jesus Christ, our great High Priest, You gave Your own life to be a holy and perfect sacrifice for us and for our salvation. Grant him a heart zealous for Your people and boldness to guide, comfort, admonish, and serve Your congregation with gentleness and wisdom. Fill him, Your undershepherd, with Your love that in Your name he will seek the straying and bear up the weak. Give him the heart never to grow weary in the service of Your flock.

O Holy Spirit, strengthen and keep him in the Word of truth and life, and support him in every time of trouble and distress. Make his labors fruitful and, when the day of labor is ended, grant him to come with rejoicing before Your presence to receive with all the saints his portion in eternal salvation.

And to You, God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all glory and honor, both now and forever. Amen.
