Faith. Instruction in Luther's Small Catechism and Private Absolution are required for all new members. Please ask the Pastor for further details.



Welcome to Holy Mass where Our Lord serves to you, and delivers into your body, His new and everlasting Testament. By His heavenly gifts He gives healing to your soul. May they also increase your love of God and your kindness toward your neighbor.

The Theme of Today's Liturgy Today's liturgy focuses on this question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" (*Gospel*) The answer is based first in what Our Lord gives in His faithful and everlasting Testament (*Epistle*). That Testament (covenant) we beg God to respect and remember by lifting us out of the oppression our

sin lays on our backs (*Introit, Gradual*). For He is our dwelling place in all generations (*Alleluia*). From Him flows the increase of faith, hope and love that He gives through His Son (*Collect*). It is this doing of Our Lord, then, that "makes us to love that which He commands" (*Collect*).

The Sermon When God addresses His creatures with a question, it is seldom because man has done well. Consider the questions God asked your first parents. The Lord, of course, knew the answers. He knew before man fell. Still, every man must stand before God and answer the questions God's Law raises. The Law was added because of transgressions. But there is more from the Apostle, there is comfort and hope, there is promise and confidence, there is deliverance and joy and happiness, which is to say... there is Gospel: The Law was added because of transgressions - until the Seed should come to whom the promise was made. And the Word of God, His gracious and loving Promise, does not say "And to seeds," as of many, but as of One, "And to your Seed," who is Christ.

The Holy Eucharist The Testament Our Lord makes with us is not only spoken but also planted within our bodies. It gives us the inheritance of eternal life. It also works in us true love for God and our neighbor.
