

## Sermon Text Discussion Notes 5/5/2019

“Purchased by the Son” from Revelation 5 by Drew Hunter

### Overview

---

In our second week in this three part series on how each member of the Trinity connects to global mission, we took a look at the work of the Son. Specifically, we see that Jesus purchased these people from all nations:

- 1) Jesus is the Lion who rules over all history
- 2) Jesus is the Lamb who ransomed people from all nations
- 3) Jesus is the One who is worthy of his reward

Jesus is the King who rules over all history, and yet he also lays down his own life for us. He has the authority over our lives due to our disobedience, but he instead is slain for us. He is the Lord over us, but he has great affection for us. This is the Jesus we get to share with the nations.

### Understanding & Application

---

- 1) What did the scroll in chapter 5 represent?
- 2) Why was John weeping? What news consoled him (and ultimately us) in his grief?
- 3) What is the significance of Jesus, the King of all Kings, appearing as a slain lamb? Explain how Jesus is both the Lion of Judah and the Lamb that was slain.
- 4) What two things in v.9-10 did Christ accomplish for his people when he was crucified on the cross?
- 5) Read v.11-14 aloud. What do these verses highlight about Christ? What other verses in Scripture support your claim?
- 6) If God is sovereign (which he is), why do we still have to “Go?” What confidence do we gain from Romans 10:14?
